Christmas and New Year have both come and gone 2026 is here.

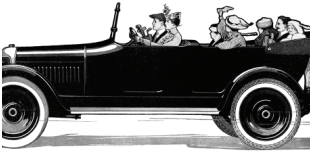

CHRISTMAS RALLY REPORT

The club Christmas run for 2025 took members to the historical town of Acland for morning tea.

The small town of Acland had its humble beginnings around 1912. It was supported by the surrounding dairy-ing industry and by the important coal mine. The railway line which only ran as far as Cooyar transported the coal away. There were 4 underground mines including Balgowan, Acland, Sugarloaf and Willaroo.

Work at the mines provided a very good living standard for its employees. In its heyday the town population was around 450 with at times around 80 pupils attending the primary school.

There were other facilities including small corner store, garage, butcher shop, bakery and of course the Railway Hotel. Unfortunately the Hotel burnt down in the early 1960s. Also there were several churches, a community dance hall and railway station.

The mine closed in 1984 as it became too expensive to operate compared to modern day open cut mining.

After morning tea we moved to the RSL at Oakey for a Christmas lunch before returning home.

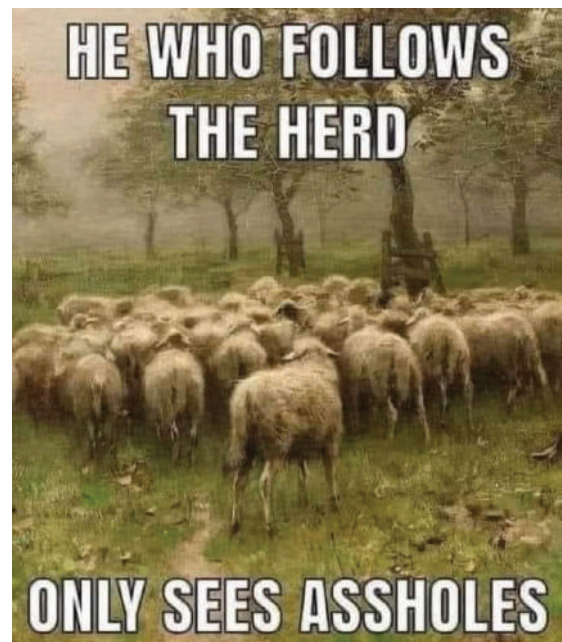

This photo was taken in Margaret St. The building on the right may be the old Post Office. A toy shop ROBERTSON AND PROVAN gave kids free rides each Christmas from around 1908. I remember a news agent in Ruthven St with the same name. Can anyone name the make of car? Possibly sold by Trevethan.



This photo is of Russell St in 1932 around Christmas time. Many of the buildings are still there. The large pub opposite the National Hotel is now Rowes. At the time, it was the PEOPLES PALACE. Lots of cars about even in depression years.



The car in the foreground may be a 36 model. It has an insert in the roof rather than steel and the boot looks like an afterthought. Holdens manufactured the 37 Chev with a complete steel turret. Note the centre parking. Some of the buildings survive to this day.



A streetscape from the veranda of Tattersal's Hotel. This photo could be late forties. You can see the Strand picture theatre on the right. In the foreground is an air raid shelter. Apparently, there was another slightly to the west of the Ruthven /Margaret intersection. One still survives opposite the railway station. There could be another at the Newtown Hotel and one in the yard of the old brewery in Mort St (now McDonald Printing)

BAILEYS CORNER but in the thirties. Apparently, it's the same building as Baileys. A third floor has been added since this photo was taken. Can you recognise the thirties car turning into Margaret St. The truck might be a mid- thirties Chev.

1913 ROVER RESTORATION:

The story started back what now seems dream time when a friend Malcom Sypher told me he had the makings of a veteran similar to his 1914 Clegg Rover roadster. I purchased the remnants as bits and pieces from around his rural property including a chassis, radiator, lights, windscreen brackets, sidelights and other brass fittings, front cross member, scuttle, bonnet, engine, tail shaft, gear box, rear axle and differential and steering wheel assembly.



My son also purchased the remains of a Dort and on impulse I also bought the remnants of a 1922 Dodge 4. So with a car garden back at his place the restoration began. We had the good fortune of being able to template parts from Malcom's car as well as from acquired workshop manuals.



I found a metal worker to compound curve the door and body frame with 1 mm sheeting and fitted to the chassis. Next I bought a granny seat assembly from Victoria which fitted perfectly behind the tub. Front and rear mudguards were made from templates using photos of original cars and bracketed to the chassis and side running boards. Silky oak has been used for dashboard, arm rests, timber between front mudguards and engine and have been finished with clear full gloss polyester. All brass work has been refurbished.



My son began with making artillery wheels by machining hubs copied from Malcom's car, rims rolled and spokes made by flaring tubes welded in and rerolled to straighten, tyres fitted followed by engine remake by machining 3" pistons and rings to suit and all the other requirements to complete the engine.

Parts such as magneto, down draught carburetor were made functional. A gravity tank fitted under the scuttle was made from stainless steel sheeting. After rust in the chassis was repaired the car was assembled to mechanically complete and driveable whilst sitting on an upturned milk crate.

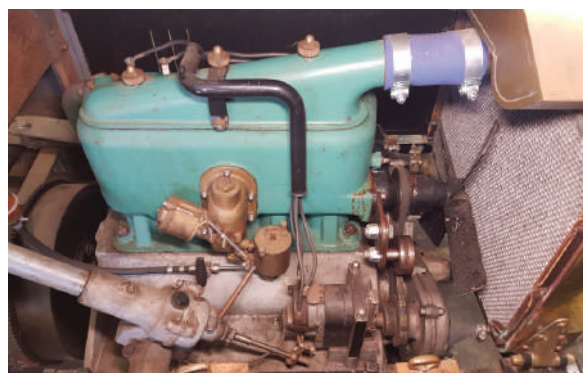


Next came building of a roadster body frame by a cabinet maker at mate's rates, which consisted of compound curves with templates made from Malcom's car. The body included a left hand door with the brake, gear change and spare wheel on the right hand side of the driver. Hood bows were made in Allora.

During all of these happenings was the saga of the Radiator. Brass era vehicles are identified by their radiators so remaking my fatigued and leaking one was imperative. I phoned around Australia and overseas to find a craftsman capable of replicating my worn out one. I found a place in England that could remake the core with round tubes but not to remake the surrounding water tank. Further enquiry with a firm south of Sydney, Lights and Lanterns where I had the lights refurbished came up with a worker who said he would make the tank. I sent a template of the core to England who in due course sent me the new one which I sent on to Sydney together with the old tank for replication. Then the owner of the business lost his wife and the business was closed down. My craftsman Peter had no workshop to do the job and to cut a long story short six years later he was given bench space at the workshop owned by Jim Frecklington, the builder of the coach presented to Queen Elizabeth for her Diamond Jubilee. Months later Peter phoned telling me he had the job finished. I asked him to send it up on Pack and Send but he refused and instead personally brought it up to avoid any chance of damage. He did a perfect job but said he would never do another one.



Finally, September 1st 2025 marked a significant occasion when I outsourced painting of my 1913 Clegg Rover to be professionally finished. Not long after that I received the Encouragement Award from the DDVVMC which has spurred me on to complete the job with upholstery and electrical wiring.

The moral to my story is: Don't put finishing time lines on home car restorations and don't keep receipts!!
