

The decision to cancel our Annual June Rally for 2025 has prompted many discussions between members on the direction our club should take in relation to the running of club events in future years.

The June Rally has always been regarded as our Club's major event for the year and has certainly provided additional income for our club during these times - <u>but do members still</u> want it?

At our April Monthly Meeting members discussed the possibility of forming a Sub-Committee to determine if members were still in favour of running the June Rally as an annual event - or maybe changing the format to a similar event at a different time of the year to better suit our club's direction?

The discussions that followed during the meeting indicated that our club finances would most likely break even for this year without the Rally, however next year is looking like a small loss unless another income stream is found.

At this stage Ray Harrison, Geffrey Holgate and Mark Thomas have volunteered to be on the Sub-Committee.

We are hoping that at least another member will come on board and help out.

This Sub-Committee is by no means the start of a Rally Committee. They will just be coordinating and reporting back to members on the survey outcome.

The survey will be sent out to all members asking them to complete the questionnaire. There will also be a section at the end of the survey that will allow members to add their own thoughts and suggestions.

Time line for Survey:

- Survey compiled and sent out to members in early May.
- Survey to be completed by members and returned by our June Meeting on Friday 13th
 June
- Outcome of survey to be discussed at our July Meeting on Friday 4th July.

Note: that the club is moving our June Monthly Meeting to Fri 13th as the long weekend falls on 6th

This is now "the time and the place" to voice your views on the direction of future events – whether you are a "new" or "aged" member of our club.

We are hoping that some fresh ideas will come out of the exercise.

ROCKLEIGH SHEARING SHED

Rod Lieschke was unable to attend the run to Rockleigh Shearing shed last month but shared this story with members at the April General meeting.

Due to commitments in our local church, we were unable make the run to Rockleigh Shearing Shed on March 9.

But years ago, the local churches of the district area combined to hold the "Blessing of the Fleece" in that same shed where many attended.

It's an old English tradition to recognise the sheep and wool industry in Australia.

To get the fleece from the single sheep in the shed it had to be shorn. I was asked and I shore the sheep and I'm sure the farmers in the congregation were only interested in what time I took to shear that sheep!

I was a shearer for 38 years, but I only ever shore that one sheep in Rockleigh shed.

Thanks very much to Rod for sharing his story.



I thought this image followed on from the High Wheelers.

Walter Marr built this car in 1901. Two years later he was successfully producing Marr automobiles but was quickly bought out by William Durant. Durant didn't want the technology – he wanted Walter Marr. It was a good move; in 1908 Walter was one of the original architects of General Motors and continued work in GM management for many years

HOWLONG RUTHERGLEN AND COROWA SUNDAY 6TH APRIL

We had a booking at the "Caffeine 'N' Machine" in Rutherglen for lunch so that was our next stop.



The Café had a comprehensive display of motor bikes, parts and memorabilia. The high tables had a display under the glass so that you could peruse and read while you were eating.





The building has a lot of history. It started in 1892 with three Jasper Brothers opening their business, with the sign reading: "Jasper Bros. Coach Builders, Blacksmith, Undertakers and Horses carefully shod".

During the sixties and still owned by the Jasper family it was converted to a Holden Dealership/ service station.

I'm not sure about the current business owners relationship to the original family but it is a very interesting place to visit.

This V8 motor bike was started up while we were there, however it doesn't move from it's spot. The last rider didn't survive the ride!



The group then headed off to Corowa where we visited the Whiskey and Chocolate factory before catching up with some of the High Wheelers and their owners in town for their rally











After talking to one of the entrants there were 23 entrants and one day they were going on a 100km drive! At a max speed of 20kmph that was going to be a very long day. They drive for an hour, have a rest for at least 30 mins before heading out again. Dedication.

All of the previous photos were taken at the motel where a large number of the entrants were staying. A contingent went on to the Caravan Park to visit some more of the entrants, but about half of us decided it was time to head home, before it got too dark.
