

CLUBROOM OPERATIONS

We have now been using the Duke of Kent Community Centre as our home base for just over 1 year. The largest event remains the 2024 June Rally where the facility performed well but no repeat event was held in 2025.

The 2024 Rego day was successful and a few tweaks are proposed for 2025 now that the boundary fence between us and the child care has been erected, tightening the turn out of the outdoor covered area.

Freedom of access to the dedicated meeting room has been confirmed so we can come and go to that room and toilet facilities as we please within reasonable hours.

The EOFY 2025 Finance Report confirmed a \$1500 profit for that year. Major costs are lease fees (including garbage), insurances and magazine costs primarily funded by investment interest and subs. We no longer have maintenance costs, building insurance, mowing roster with costs, and public utilities costs.

Additional lease fees apply for events exceeding 12 GM s and one use of the outdoor covered area with a 50% discount.

The possibility of income becoming taxable remains a concern. Interest rates are also in decline.

Erection of the Club's sign, together with U3A's sign remains with Council.

Submissions included in the recent Major Event Survey confirm that some members still resent loss of our old clubrooms but others are happy to move on and make the most of the new facility. Thanks go to my subcommittee for room setup, kitchen readiness and cleanup, and checking that toilet facilities are serviceable.


The trip to Bethungra was a great success and heartily enjoyed by all. Thank you Colleen for organising.
