

ROOTES RAMBLINGS AUGUST 2025

The last 2 months have all passed in a blur for me with time in hospital and recovery. I do not want to do that again and there is still a way to go. A big thank you to David Phillips and all the Committee for keeping everything just rolling along. I would also like to thank so many of you for your phone calls and messages of support, it was greatly appreciated – thankyou.

On electrical matters, we weren't but we are now, I read an article just recently on the road test of a Lexus SUV. I was amused to see that in "M" (manual) mode the car's eight virtual gears can be shifted up and down via the paddles on the steering wheel. The car then replicates rev changes with accompanying engine noises and a tachometer shows the virtual rpm. Only trouble is, this is an electric car and so there are no gears or engine noises. Perhaps some people enjoy these fake gears and sounds but surely if you move from one technology to another you don't cling to the past. When we shifted from horses and carts we didn't make cars that sounded like horses and as we say, "You can't beat the sound of a good V8"!!!

Another electrical noise rearing its head is the cost to the tax payer of the waiving of the Fringe Benefit Tax by the government on EVs which makes them cheaper to lease than their ICE equivalents. Treasury has estimated that in the first four years up to this year the scheme will have cost \$1.15bn with a further year to go. That means each one of us is donating money towards the uptake of these electric vehicles. One has to wonder that if they are so good why do they need incentives to sell especially as at present they pay no road tax! Finally there are some rumblings to rectify this and it appears that electric trucks will be the trial horses for the scheme. As you know we are paying 51.6 c on every litre of fuel as a "road tax" and the EVs which are 3-400 kilograms heavier than their ICE counterparts, are harder on our roads and wear the tyres more quickly, pay nothing. It will be interesting to see if this affects sales when it is introduced. Enough electrical stuff, just ask the English cars!!

If you were born in the 1870s, no names, because I don't want Bob Otto being congratulated on almost being a centenarian!!!! (I'm sure he told me that.) but an article, which I have paraphrased, came across my desk which will bring back some memories for him! This came from a 1962 Sydney paper, concerning petrol prices, and you wonder if anything has really changed. "The Australian companies intend to raise the octane rating of their super grade petrols from 93 to 98. It will still be called Super and will retail at 3/8d a gallon, (roughly 9c/litre). This is in response to the American companies, Amoco and Phillips increasing market surge with their newer style petrol stations. Critics of the Australian companies say that due to the falling price of crude, the cost should already have dropped by 1d a gallon!! The companies say they have constantly raised the quality of their fuel from the post war figure of 72octane and have given the public the benefit of stable prices. They have also made available petrol with a 100 octane for 4/3 d a gallon for the owners of high performance cars."!! Doesn't that sound like the same old story today? As a matter of interest in 2008 oil was \$180 a barrel, (157I) and we paid \$1.42 at the pump. In 2022, oil was only \$125 a barrel but we paid \$2.22 at the pump! Many would ask are they fleecing us and if they are, is it a golden fleece??!!!

I was very disappointed to miss our day at Highvale as I have had a perfect record since the start but never mind there is always next year and I know I couldn't have lasted the day. It was good to hear that there was a good roll up and thanks to David for doing the organising.

Hopefully some of my car issues are being resolved. The TR7 is now back together after having the head shaved to remove some old irregularities and it seems to going with renewed vigour. Not sure why the head was not perfect after its first complete restoration at the beginning – such is life. I haven't been able to get out in the Humber as the clutch is a bit much for my knee at the moment but I am really looking forward to getting it out and stretching its legs. Those invitational runs with the Ipswich Club are great for terrific scenery and a chance to get some good miles under the old girl. If you haven't been on one you should come along, they are a great day out.

At the end of the month I will be going on my Early Ford V8 Club's Spring Tour down to Grafton and surrounds for a week These are great runs and we have them every second year. Not only do they give the car some good long runs but the socializing in the afternoon is very enjoyable. It is very important to keep up your 'hydration' as you all should know!! We also get to see great scenery and wonderful places. I'll write a brief report next month.





It is anticipated that these Impromptu Events will often take place during mid-week outside of the regular Club events.

You will be asked to obtain the names of attendees and for them to sign an attendance sheet.

WEARING OF SEAT BELTS—CLASSIC VEHICLES

The government camera scheme to detect wearing of seatbelts has been clarified by the Transport Main Roads with respect to wearing them whilst in a Classic car built prior to 1969 (when seat-belts were not installed when manufactured). A representative of the TMR has stated that all photos taken are cross-referenced with the vehicle registration details and if the vehicle is prior to 1969 and NO belts were fitted, NO FURTHER ACTION WOULD OCCUR—THE PHOTO WOULD BE DISMISSED.

However, if a photo was inadvertently processed and a summons was issued, contact TMR and they will deal with it in your favour.
