PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As with last month September has been a busy month for us as we have travelled in the Sunbeam Rapier for a southern trip to the Sunbeam Nationals at South Australia's Victor Harbor.

Before we headed south, we caught up with one of our members Garry Ellis at the annual Stanthorpe Historic Vehicle and Machinery Group car club car display and swap meet.

There was a great selection of cars inside the main building and the one that grabbed my attention was the Citroen Ami 8 from the 1970's: a really unusual car. Plus, Garry displayed his Mark 3 Humber Super Snipe and his very original Commer truck.

The Club put on a great display with over thirty different categories being judged by Garry and his team, a great effort and day for all the car owners and the public who attended in large numbers.

The next day, Sunday we caught up with Ray and Gill Sanders from New Zealand for the drive for our first nights' accommodation in Tamworth.

On Monday we headed to a small town called Nundle which has a wool spinning mill which is still operational using hundred-year-old spinning and dyeing machines; well worth the short detour on the trip south of Tamworth. That afternoon we took the short cut road from Quirindi to Dubbo and unfortunately with the numerous concrete causeways my rear exhaust bracket and exhaust came off. With a quick temporary repair, we limped into Coolah where the local mechanic fixed my bracket and exhaust to allow us to make Dubbo in fading light.

On Tuesday we visited Dubbo Zoo and the four of us hired one-speed push bikes which is the best way of seeing the numerous animal displays - a fantastic zoo.

Headed to Forbes that night and enjoyed the 2 for the price of 1 meals at the Forbes Inn Hotel, great value and meal if you ever stay there on a Tuesday night.

Leaving Forbes, we headed to Grenfell and Young with the rain increasing as we headed towards the Victorian border. We just missed a small tornado by less than an hour and stopped at the Junee chocolate factory for lunch and also visited a small car collection of mostly English and Australian Fords, although there was a Humber Vogue and Hillman Minx stored at the back of the display shed.

We stayed in an old gold mining town just outside Albury called Chiltern. We didn't realise that the main train freight line was only 100 meters away unfortunately.

On Thursday we decided that some retail therapy was required for Lyn and Gill, so we detoured to Bendigo and after a few hours needed to hit the road for our final night's stay in Horsham before the drive to Victor Harbor on the Friday.

I have always found that the journey to any car Nationals is in many ways part of the great adventure in travelling there. We travelled over 1500 miles in five days in the great company of Ray and Gill Sanders, and no we did not travel the furthest as the WA contingent drove their Sunbeam Alpines across the Nullarbor Plain for a total distance of over 2000 miles.

Clyde Northcott also made the trip with his Sunbeam Tiger joining the Sunbeam Tiger boys from NSW in their trip to South Australia.

I know Clyde will have more to report on this great event. Once again with over 100 attendees and 50 cars on display Paul Heuer and his team ran a faultless Nationals. This raises the bar once again for all of us to aspire to going forward.



His job will then require resending the Application as an email to ALL members.

Accordingly, the Application will require a start time and those members wishing to take part in the Event will need to phone the Applicant to obtain the requisite details.

It is anticipated that these Impromptu Events will often take place during mid-week outside of the regular Club events.

You will be asked to obtain the names of attendees and for them to sign an attendance sheet.

WEARING OF SEAT BELTS—CLASSIC VEHICLES

The government camera scheme to detect wearing of seatbelts has been clarified by the Transport Main Roads with respect to wearing them whilst in a Classic car built prior to 1969 (when seat-belts were not installed when manufactured). A representative of the TMR has stated that all photos taken are cross-referenced with the vehicle registration details and if the vehicle is prior to 1969 and NO belts were fitted, NO FURTHER ACTION WOULD OCCUR—THE PHOTO WOULD BE DISMISSED.

However, if a photo was inadvertently processed and a summons was issued, contact TMR and they will deal with it in your favour.


