

Triumph TR7 V8 vs a Bull – Robin McIver

I went to Bathurst with my car trailer to purchase a TR7 V8. Due to fog, ice and the terrible state of the New England Highway, along with the threat of kangaroos and goats, I was late getting back. I decided to do the right thing and stayed the night in a motel rather than driving in the dark.

Next morning I was driving through Cunninghams Gap when a one tonne bull charged my car. I swerved and it just missed me but smashed into the TR7 damaging it and the trailer. He defecated as it hit my classic and all his legs came off the ground. Adding a tonne at speed caused my tow car to pull up. He lay there on the road for ten minutes bleeding and then staggered up with a broken leg. I called 000 and directed traffic. The Police used a high-powered assault rifle to euthanise the bull and it took three shots! The Police say they had never come across such a scenario and struggled to complete the report and give me an insurance claim number, as no one normally has three of their vehicles damaged at the same time in the same incident!

I have had to make multiple claims for tow mounts and rear suspension on the tow car to be inspected, the trailer to be assessed and repaired as well as the classic. \$11500 of damage and some parts and panels have to come from the UK. The front chassis, inner wing, nose panel, pop-up lights, bumper, bonnet guard etc all need replacing/repairing and then painting.

Not a great start to ownership of the TR7, so fingers crossed it is plain sailing after the repairs have been completed.











The panel beater has started repairs and I am heading down to Tamworth where a chap who used to work for Jaguar-Triumph in the 1970's has a lot of parts. When BL pulled out of Australia, he bought a warehouse full of parts. They were going to be scrapped. The panels are actually New Old Stock which was a real find as some of the panels are no longer available, even in the UK. **ROBIN**

COOL CARS – R – Rambler Ambassador







The Rambler Ambassador was an automobile manufactured by American Motors Corporation (AMC) from 1957 through to 1974 and was available in two and four-door sedan, two-door hardtop, four-door station wagon as well as two-door convertible body styles. Road testers liked the speed, room, luxury and the high resale value of the early models. It was reasonably priced, had a safety package option, 'deep dip' rustproofing and a thoroughly modern monocoque shell. Buyers wanted a 'cool car' but this car was really for middle-aged 'squares'.

Ambassadors were continuously manufactured at AMC's Lake Front plant in Kenosha, Wisconsin as well as At AMC's Brampton Assembly, Ontario. 
1966 Ambassador Convertible




