

#### 1912 OVERLAND 61R ROADSTER

If you went on the run to the Coolamon Fire Muster on Sunday 5th October you would have been surprised to see this 1912 Overland 61R Roadster roll into our clubrooms all fired up for the 80 odd km return run. This gorgeous machine is owned by Nigel Smith and he has given us some history on the vehicle to share with you. It has brass fittings everywhere you look - from the massive head lights and side lamps, though to the radiator and even down to the handgrip on the crankhandle.

The following history was compiled by its previous owner - Brian Love.



My nickname is "Grunt" (because I have lots). I was born in Toledo Ohio USA in the year of 1912, I am an Overland Roadster and was given the number R61-1779. I have 4 cylinders with a diameter of 4 3/8" and rated at 45 horsepower for registration purposes. I made my way to Australia and Mr. Robert Glasson of "Tremsarne" of Lucknow NSW saw me in my shiny Brewster Green paint and could not resist my charm, so became my first owner. My first registration number was 3843, after some years I became the property of Mr. Barry Willis King. I was no longer registered by then and feeling rather forlorn. I believe Mr. King owned me for about 25 years and never exercised me. My next known custodian was Mr. Gunner Sundell a motor dealer from Sydney and he also did very little to me and I was getting very tired and dishevelled by now. I was in his care for approximately 20 years.

We are now in the year 1989 I believe and a nice gentleman named John Miller from Melbourne heard of my plight and made a trip from Melbourne to Sydney and purchased my remains. By this time my clothes had disappeared and I was reduced to a rather sad pile of rust and junk. John scrubbed my chassis up and made a few new parts to start my return to life. Sadly John passed away suddenly at a young age in 1996 before he could get much done and I found myself with another custodian Brian and Maria Love from Northern Victoria.

It was now May 4th. 1997. I now found myself getting a new wooden frame and various sheets of metal being wrapped around my body. Some of my internal organs were in rather sad condition after 80 odd years of neglect and use, so they were rebuilt to good health.

Brian had the help of some good friends during this process, in particular Mr Bruce Nelson a wonderful man, also Rob Tingay for wrapping my sheet metal, Rob Simons for making me shine again in Brewster Green.

This took 2 years and I have now been getting some exercise for the last 20 odd years which is what I enjoy the most. I love running and climbing hills. Due to my age (I am now 111,) I have the occasional hissy fit. When the temperature is around zero, I am reluctant to spring out of bed sometimes. I recently had a bit of trouble with my food intake on a 3 day run around Maryborough in Victoria (indigestion I believe, now cured).

I was near my original home territory in NSW recently for the Early Overland Roundup (the largest gathering of veteran Overlands worldwide). I was given a ride on a trailer to Cowra NSW, where I had a most enjoyable 4 days cavorting with my brothers, cousins and nephews, approximately 30 of them. We had a wonderful time, running up and down hills to alot of my old stamping grounds, but I think some of the roads up there are worse than I remember a 100 years ago! The weather was most agreeable.







Hope the fibreglass repairs on the side wall of the tyre will dry in time for the rego day? Painting the tyre with "Tyre Black" won't be a problem - it dries quick!
